THE JUNIOR ACADEMY MONTESSORI PREPARATORY PROGRAM

The Junior Academy is committed to the education of the whole child and provides learning experiences in a stimulating, challenging and creative environment. The Montessori Preparatory Program is a gathering of children from 3 – 6 years old who learn together in a prepared environment that offer choices of individual activities that aid children's work of "self construction".

Children at this age will learn through their senses and absorb information effortlessly through movement and hands-on materials. The focus of Montessori education is not academic readiness but the learning and development of the whole child – socially, emotionally, physically and intellectually.

The most important period of life is not the age of university studies, but the first one, the period from birth to the age of six. For that it is the time when man's intelligence itself, his greatest implement is being formed.

Experience the lifelong love of learning in a multisensory environment. Based on Montessori principles that focus on personal development rather than tests, The Junior Academy Montessori Preparatory Program presents challenges at an individual pace and level of difficulty appropriate to each child.

A JUMPSTART TO LEARNING

Designed for 3 – 6 years old, the program seeks to support each child's intellectual, physical, emotional and social growth by focusing on critical areas of development including four distinct areas: practical life skills, sensory exploration, reading and language and mathematics. The fifth area, often referred to as cultural or science, combines work from both sensorial and language.

Practical Life offers opportunity to instill care for self, others and environment while setting the foundation for independence and self-reliance. This area helps develop self-confidence while laying the groundwork for all areas of the curriculum.

Sensorial exercises allow children to perceive, observe materials, classify and clarify information into finer distinctions, and comprehend their world through the use of five senses.

Reading and Language exercises allow children to learn phonetic skills necessary for composition and reading. The hand, which has been developing control and coordination in Practical Life activities and Sensorial exploration, is now ready to begin the formation of letters. Through effortless learning the child now "explodes" into reading and writing!

Mathematics activities include counting and number relationships, with an overview of the function of the decimal system. Careful design of materials in the mathematics area and in the sensorial area lays the groundwork for future learning in algebra and geometry.

Cultural Studies that relates to world cultures and traditions, art and history, and geographical locations will help the child to explore the larger world and form an appreciation of life.

The mixed age classes offer opportunities to learn which do not exist in same-age settings. The older, experienced children become leaders and role models to the younger children, who absorb social values and cultural impressions from the activities of the older children. This also allows the teacher to develop close and long term relationships with their pupils. This comes from the greatest level of social development - mutual care and respect.

OUR GOALS

Every child is encouraged to practice critical thinking, creative problem solving, collaborative effort and clear communication skills. For each child, our goals are to:

- » Develop your child's potential through self-choice and self-expression.
- » Develop a sense of high self-esteem.
- » Build habits of concentration.
- » Foster inner discipline and a sense of order.
- » Develop positive social behavior skill.
- » Develop a positive attitude toward school and learning.
